Why Do I Serve as a Vincentian?

I felt called to get involved at Holy Cross when my family and I joined in 2021 and I saw a note in the bulletin about the need for volunteers for the St. Vincent DePaul group. I have been humbled by the ability to be the hands and feet of God to our neighbors. My first call as a Vincentian was from a family who had hit some really hard times. The wife had lost her job during COVID and after her unemployment ran out, she and her husband had decided that they could make it on his income alone. He was in construction and owned his own business, their kids were all grown and out of the house, all they had was their house payment and basic bills. Life was good and they saw themselves happily moving towards retirement. Of course, that wasn't what was in the cards... A few months into their plan, the husband had a very serious stroke and was unable to work, in the hospital for months, and they ultimately depleted their savings. By the time the wife called us for help the couple was in danger of losing their home, having their electricity shut off, and their water disconnected. They had hit rock bottom and were doing their best to just survive. Through the help of our SVDP conference and the neighboring conferences, as well as the Brighton Center, we were able to help this family save their home, restore their power and water, and bring them much needed food. Above all else, we were able to bring the light of God to the family in a time when they were struggling. To hear the trembling voices on the phone and see the tears of sadness turn to hope is what we are all about. We have continued to support this family through minor things as they fall in their path, with groceries and a Christmas meal, all the while seeing the hope in their faces and the love of God reflected back at us as we visit them.
