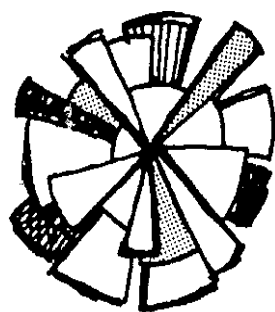

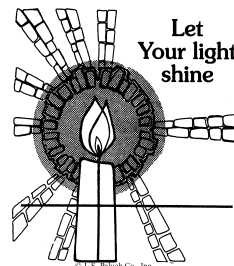


Reading II



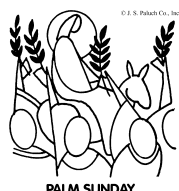

A Glance at the Week from Fr. Hennigen

- Today is Palm Sunday, so the Masses will begin outside in front of the Church, you are invited to get a palm and remain outside for the beginning of Mass and then we all process in or you can already be seated at the beginning of Mass and you will be able to hear the beginning of the Mass. We celebrate with joy our Lord's triumphant entry into Jerusalem.
- This week is Holy Week, the holiest week of the year. All are invited to the Chrism Mass at the Cathedral at 7:00pm on Tuesday the 4th. This is the night Bishop Iffert will bless the oil of the sick, the oil of Catechumens, and consecrate the Sacred Chrism for all the parishes in the diocese. Also, at the Mass all of us priests will renew our priestly promises.
- After the 9:00am and 6:00pm Masses is the Stations of the Cross on Wednesday.
- Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday are the Sacred Triduum. Mass of the Lord's Supper is at 7:00pm on Thursday the 6th. There is no 9:00am Mass on the 6th. On Good Friday, the 7th, is Stations of the Cross at 12:00 noon, the celebration of the Lord's Passion at 3:00pm and 7:00pm. There is no candlelight Mass on the 7th. On the 8th the Easter Vigil Mass is at 8:30pm where those entering the Church will be baptized, receive First Communion, and Confirmation. It is a beautiful Mass that begins with a fire out in front of church. To really have a fuller celebration of Easter to attend Holy Thursday and Good Friday before celebrating Easter either at the vigil or at the Sunday morning Masses at 8:30am, 10:30am, and noon.
