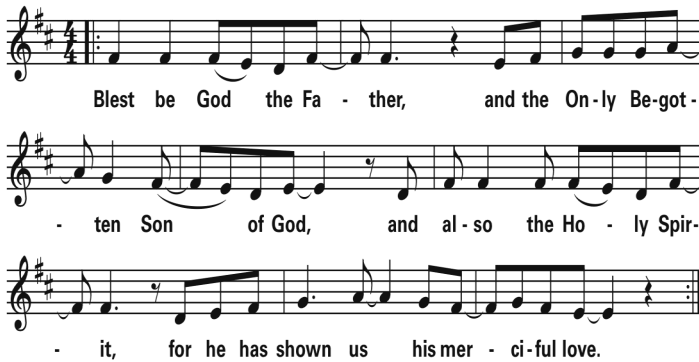



A Glance at the Week from Fr. Hennigen

- This weekend we celebrate the Most Holy Trinity, the central teaching of our Faith. The Holy Trinity is a Communion of Love and we have been invited and are made to enter into this communion of Love with the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
- I am grateful to Father Robbins for celebrating the 4:30pm Mass this weekend as Father Gedney has a wedding and I have a 2:30pm wedding at the parish and then a 5:30pm wedding at a church in Lexington.
- Today, Sunday, at 1:00pm is the Walk the Bridge for Life in Newport. I am unable attend due to another commitment. Let us continue to pray always for the dignity and protection of all human life from conception to natural death. This week is our VBS from 6:00 to 8:00pm, Monday to Friday, for grades K to 8. Registration is on Monday night at 6:00pm or any night.
- June 11th is Corpus Christi, the solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus. It is on this weekend that we will begin the distribution of the Precious Blood at two cup stations. You are welcome to receive the Precious Blood. In receiving the Body of Christ, the Host, we receive Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. To offer the distribution of the chalice, is a fuller expression of communion. Also, the past few years we had a Corpus Christi procession between the 8:30 and 10:30am Masses, this year we will not be having a procession as a parish, as the diocese would like all of the diocese to participate in a procession at the Cathedral at 2:00pm.

Attention Parish Family

The Holy Rosary will be prayed and led every Sunday morning at 8:00am before the 8:30am Mass. It is a beautiful way to prepare for Mass, to ask for our Mother Mary's intercession, and to stand the foot of Jesus' Holy Cross as a beloved disciple.

Resumption of Precious Blood of Christ

Beginning with the weekend Masses on June 10-11, Bishop Iffert has given our Diocese permission to resume distribution of the Precious Blood of Christ during Communion. Receiving the Precious Blood is optional for each person. The consecrated host and wine individually contain the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ.

At the Holy Cross weekend Masses, we will offer two stations for the Precious Blood. One station will be available for the middle aisle pews closest to the statue of St. Joseph and the side aisle by the confessional. The other station will cover the middle aisle pews closest to the statue of the Blessed Mother and the side aisle by Mary's statue.

For each Mass, we will need two additional Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, i.e., six ministers for the 4:30pm Saturday Mass and five ministers for each Sunday Mass. If you are a minister assigned to the cup (Precious Blood), it is your choice if you wish to receive the precious blood. The priest and deacon are available to consume any remaining contents of the cup after you are finished distribution of the Precious Blood.

Holy Cross Elementary School News
