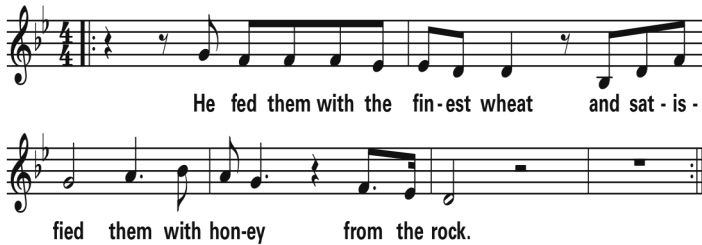

### A Glance at the Week from Fr. Hennigen

- This weekend we celebrate Corpus Christi, the solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus. It is on this weekend that we will begin the distribution of the Precious Blood at two cup stations. You are welcome to receive the Precious Blood. In receiving the Body of Christ, the Host, we receive Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. To offer the distribution of the chalice, is a fuller expression of communion. All 4 Communion lines go up the same way that we have always been doing it, but the two stations with the Body of Christ on the ends will move over to the corners of the church and the two Cup Stations with the Precious Blood will be in front of the two aisles where everyone walks down to return to their seats.
- Because of the 2:00pm Eucharistic Procession at the Cathedral on Sunday June 11th, as everyone is invited and encouraged to attend, we then we're not going to have our own procession between the Mass like we did the last 4 years, but parish processions are still allowed, so we will have our procession also around the block between the 8:30 and 10:30am Masses.
- I will be away from early Sunday morning the 11th to late Saturday night the 17th leading a youth retreat of 25 youth and other chaperones from CCH to Wyoming. They have been doing these retreats for over twenty years and have 3 group trips every summer and I am help leading one of the trips. I have been invited to go on the trip for 6 years, as long as I have been chaplain at CCH, and with summer weddings I have not been able to go but this year it worked with my schedule and I am looking forward to it. Please pray for us and know of my prayers.
- Friday the 16th and Saturday the 17th are the Feasts of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary. To celebrate these feasts we will have adoration in the Church from 6:00pm on the 16th to midnight on the 17th (so still that Friday night). Stop in anytime to adore the Lord. Our Knights of Columbus will cover each hour to make sure someone is in the church adoring the Lord. The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus have mercy on us and the Most Immaculate Heart of Mary pray for us.
