


National Eucharistic Congress

From Wednesday, July 17th to Sunday July 21st, the Bishops of the United States will host a National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis, IN. The Diocese of Covington, has been allotted 250 discounted tickets for the faithful of our Diocese. The distribution of these tickets to the faithful of Covington will be done via a "lottery." Every registered household of the Diocese of Covington will be eligible. Households made of a single individual will be permitted one "guest." All other households will be eligible for tickets for every member of their immediate household (ie: Parents and children who live at home, or an Adult who has a parent living with them). Household names will be drawn until all tickets are distributed. For example: If the first household drawn has three members and the second household has seven members, there will only be 240 tickets left to be drawn.

The discounted tickets will cost \$100 each. If tickets are purchased directly through the National Eucharistic Congress...the standard individual ticket is \$375 each—\$299 per parent, and \$99 per child—and \$299 for priests, deacons and religious. These tickets include entry to Lucas Oil Stadium for all five days of the Congress and access to general sessions, breakouts, liturgies, vendor hall, Catholic makers market, and unique tracks. What is not included is housing, transportation and food.
