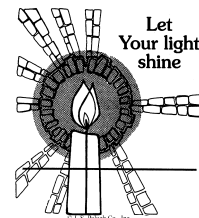

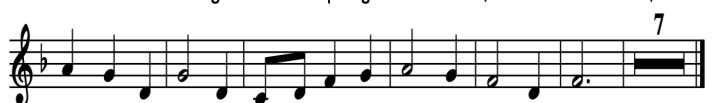

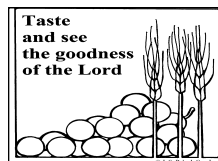

- On Friday the 20th, following the 9:00am Mass the school kids will be praying the Rosary and all are welcome to pray the rosary with them.

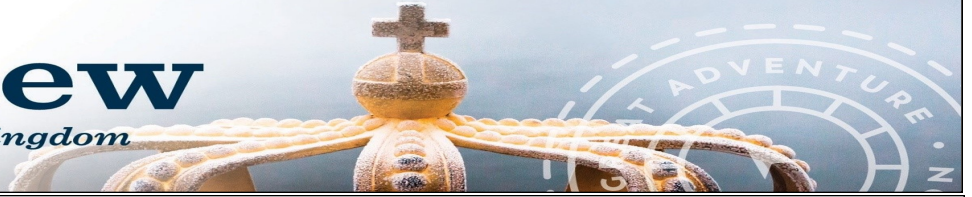
