Gospel Jn 1:35-42



Adult Faith Formation Presents The Bible Timeline

The Bible is at the heart of our Faith and our relationship with God. It is the place where our Father meets with us and lovingly speaks to us. Reading the Bible should bring us closer to Jesus, but understanding it is often difficult. The Good News is that you can understand the Bible.

The Bible Timeline, a 23-week Bible study split into three segments (8 weeks in Winter/Lent 2024, 8 weeks in Fall/Advent 2024 and 7 weeks in Winter/Lent 2025), makes it easy.

These sessions will be held on Sundays after the 10:30 am Mass (beginning January 28) and on Thursdays after the 9 am Mass (beginning February 1). Each week, we will watch an exciting DVD presentation by Jeff Cavins of Ascension Press followed by a discussion of the key points.
